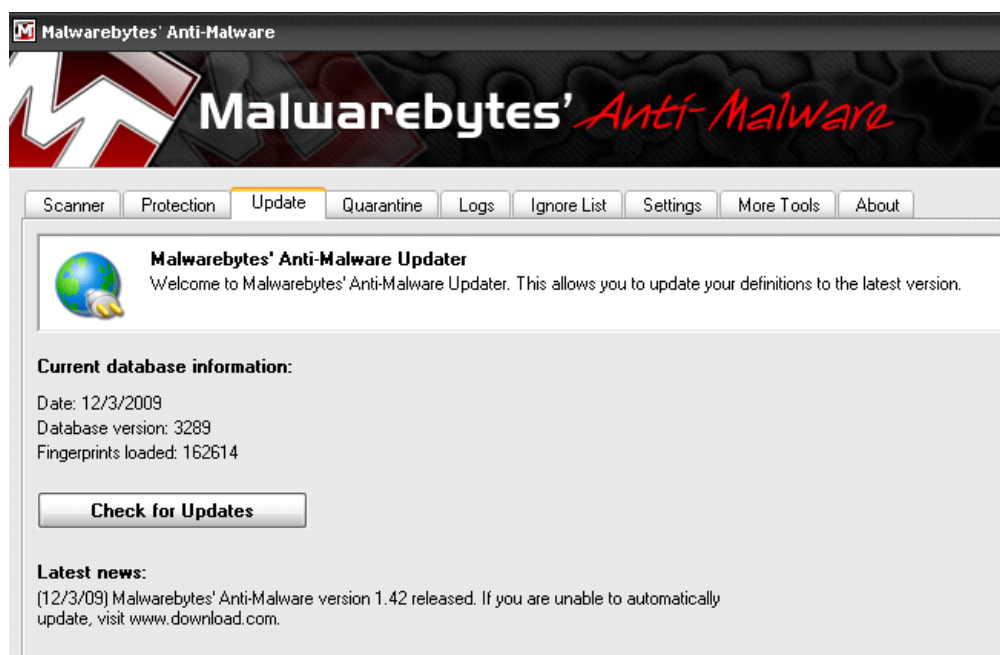


# Malwarebytes How-To Update & Scan

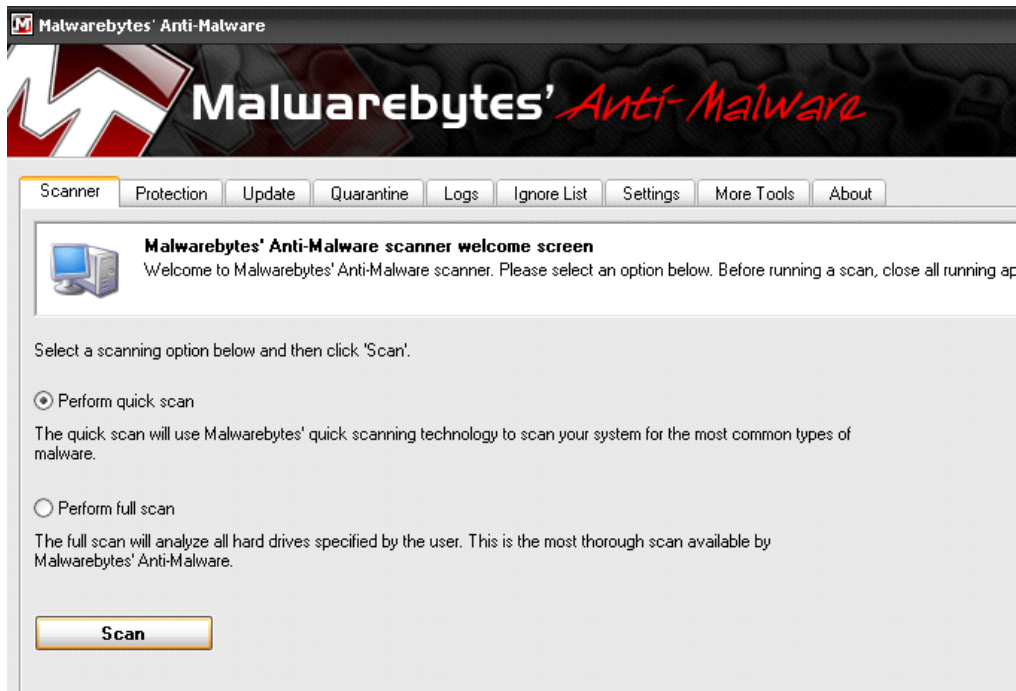
Like anything nothing is "Full-Proof" there is always someone that is going to be faster than any Anti-Virus/Anti-Malware Software company and you may get infected again. Well you are now a little more prepared to fight against anything bad. We have installed on your PC "Malwarebytes" Software this software is updated regularly by its company and is free to use. They do sale it for people that don't want to do things manually and if your one of them people fee free to pay for it. But with this easy how-to Document you can feel at ease performing these simple tasks to utilize the software to its fullest for Free.

1. Run Malwarebytes from either the Desktop Icon or by going through the Start Menu, All Programs, Malwarebytes' Anti Malware, Then click on Malwarebytes' Anti Malware Icon.
2. Click on the "UPDATE" Tab.

3. When you see the screen above click on the "Check for Updates" button.
4. When this is completed Malwarebytes will do 1 of 2 things
  - a. Tell you that it has completed the update and you can click ok
  - b. Tell you that it has downloaded the latest version and will install it and then re launch the program after it is completed.
5. Once it is completed step 4 getting things updated Click on the "Scanner Tab"



6. Choose the "Perform quick scan" then Click the scan button.
7. This will take a few minutes or maybe even an hour just be patient and let the Program finish its best to let this run without using the PC at all.
8. Once it is completed you'll see if it has anything by clicking the Show Results Button on the bottom right of the screen.
9. When you click the show Results it will bring up what it found "if anything" and if it did find anything just click on the "remove Selected Items" and they shall be removed.

People ask me how often they should do this all the time. I always say its best to run at least once a week but if you want you can do this every other week or once a month. Its strictly up to the user but if you run it once a week you have a less of a chance of a situation becoming a more difficult situation to where this program couldn't help it if it was developing. "err on the side of caution always"
